

Total Appropriations by Program Area FY 2023-2024 \$118,628.0 (millions)







# Analyzing How Childcare Impacts Florida's Workforce Productivity and the State's Economy



- Childcare issues result in an estimated \$5.38 billion loss annually for Florida's Economy
- 15% of parents with young children have left the workforce in the past six months due to challenges accessing childcare / early learning
- 64% of parents with young children have had to miss work in the past three months for childcare-related challenges
- Of those parents leaving work, 45% plan to be out longer than one year
- 48% of parents in school, with children under six, reduced their class load or stopped out all together












# Florida Voter Registration as of February 29, 2024 (via ChamberHub, the Florida Chamber's Exclusive Voter File)
